

Costa Mesa Sewer Rehabilitation Along the I-405

Starting later this month, the Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) will begin construction within the Brookview Community.

As part of the **OC San Costa Mesa Sewer Rehabilitation Along the I-405 Project (Along the 405)**, the following work is scheduled:

- What: Tree removal, approximately six trees, within an OC San easement area for access improvements to existing facilities.
- When: Week of February 24 for 1 day*
- Hours: 8 a.m. 5 p.m.*
- Impacts:

- Parking in the immediate work area may be unavailable. Signage will be posted.
- $\circ\,$ Increase in activity and noise levels

*Dates and times are subject to change due to operational factors or inclement weather.

Upcoming work to occur starting March 2025 includes the rehabilitation of the regional sewer pipeline. More information and specifics will be provided as that work approaches.

Sewer Rehabilitation Along the 405

Project Information

The Costa Mesa Sewer Rehabilitation Along the I-405 (Along the 405) Project will rehabilitate approximately 4 miles of the regional sewer pipeline that runs along the I-405 freeway in the City of Costa Mesa. The project will rehabilitate sewer pipelines, manhole structures, and improve access to manholes. The project also includes the rehabilitation of several sewer pipelines that cross under the freeway.

Project Need

OC San is committed to protecting public health and the environment by proactively replacing and maintaining its infrastructure. The existing sewer line was constructed in the 1960s and needs to be rehabilitated and repair cracks in the pipe to extend its useful life for another 25-30 years and to continue providing reliable sewer service.
